# Little Wagtail A book in the Håkon Haakonsen series

Seven-year-old Mari is playing on the beach outside the house where she lives. It's a rainy October day, and her mom has a visitor—her new boyfriend, Petter. Mari doesn't like him. She dreams of her real dad—whom she only remembers from a black-and-white photo on her nightstand—coming to visit one day.

There are many real-life examples of young girls being held captive by despicable men. Some for years. Often in dark basements, in ordinary neighborhoods, where no one suspects what's happening behind their neighbor's walls. Could the same thing happen in Kodal, the peaceful little village just outside Sandefjord?

After previously publishing four other books, Myriam H. Bjerkli made her debut as a crime author in March 2017 with the novel Little Wagtail, a book that was nominated for the Maurits Hansen Prize – New Blood.

In February 2019 "Stella Polaris" was released, which was nominated for the "Silver Knife" – a crime award given annually during the crime festival "Bloody Serious in the Village" in Randaberg.

She was also nominated for the same prize in 2022 for her next novel, "The Fall of the Angel", and in 2023, she was awarded the prize for "Green-eyed Monster."
