Foster parents Ernst and Helga Vadland are found murdered at their farm in Jæren. When police officer Tom Grayston and his partner Dagny Stokka arrive at the crime scene, it turns out that a foster child is missing. Who is the foster child, and can it be connected to the murders? In the search for the truth, the foster child is not the only one carrying secrets.

Blood Is Thicker Than Water is a realistic police crime novel. In the investigation of the murders, central issues concerning child welfare and animal welfare are addressed.

The novel was published in 2021 by Liv Forlag and is the second in the crime series.

Why crime fiction about child welfare?

Espen Skjerven judges all types of cases, including child welfare cases. A characteristic of these cases is that they are exempt from public access. In *Blood Is Thicker Than Water*, he presents several of the challenges from different perspectives:

- The child welfare service
- Foster children
- Biological parents
- Investigators Tom Grayston and Dagny Stokka
